

Community Warehouse Project of Chester County receives \$50,000 grant award to support their Bed Campaign.

Located in West Chester, PA, Community Warehouse Project of Chester County (CWP) was launched in 2017 with a mission to provide household goods and furniture to Chester County families and individuals in need – at no charge. Through a vast network of community partners, and by utilizing the support of dozens of volunteers, CWP redistributes unwanted, yet high-quality, furniture and household goods to individuals and families in need, primarily to those moving from homelessness to housing.

“As the only furniture bank in Chester County, we have a very important role in the county’s social safety net. Research shows those who move into a furnished home are much more likely to maintain their housing, and one of the most important pieces of furniture is a bed,” says Glenda Brion, CWP’s executive director.

During their last program year, CWP distributed nearly 700 beds and served over 1,300 individuals, including 649 children and 124 veterans, by diverting about 250 tons of furniture and household goods from landfills. “We don’t receive near enough clean, usable beds to fill the need,” says Brion, “making Foxwynd’s grant critical to our operations.”

The Foxwynd Foundation DAF funded the Foxwynd Foundation’s generous donation. The \$50,000 grant award will cover costs for about 350 beds. Along with the award, Foxwynd Foundation will provide an additional \$15,000 challenge grant if CWP is able to raise \$15,000 through donations.
